

Report of the Education AR – 2016

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4 The Immediate Past President shall be responsible for the supervision and direction
5 of the Area of Responsibility-Education. The Dental Education Program shall
6 reside in this area. Also, association matters pertaining to, but not limited to, oral
7 health education shall be in the area of Education.

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9 The Dental Education Program provides Hawaii Dental Association members with
10 quality continuing dental education from internationally recognized speakers at a
11 reasonable cost. Additionally, it provides members the opportunity to visit over 100
12 exhibitors, who share the latest in dental products and services, and feature a full display
13 of state-of-the-art equipment and technology. Program Chair Dr. Derek Ichimura and
14 program members help to plan, organize and run The Hawaii Dental Association
15 Convention in January every year. Dr. Ichimura has done an exceptional job as chair. A
16 three year transition is now under way with Dr. Jacklyn Lum assuming full responsibility
17 for the 2017 meeting.

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19 The Convention’s current “Fully-sponsored Speaker Model” has helped control
20 expenditures without compromising the quality of the education offered. However, in an
21 effort to continue to meet the needs of the Program, a decision was made to implement a
22 “Grant Model” starting with the HDA Convention in 2017. This \$3,000 grant per speaker
23 will allow program planners the flexibility to select speakers that are not currently
24 available to speak due to the lack of full sponsorship. This should allow more leverage
25 regarding the speakers, the content of the lectures, and recourse in the event the speaker
26 does not comply with their contractual agreement

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28 2016’s convention included the Women’s Breakfast, Life Member Lunch and casino
29 night. The HDA Young Dentists also held their first class within the convention
30 timeframe and we can look forward to similar collaborative efforts .

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32 The 2017 convention is scheduled for Jan. 12 and 13, 2017 with all speakers confirmed.
33 The 2018 convention (Jan. 18 and 19, 2018) is currently being finalized with the ADA
34 confirmed for Oct. 18 – 22, 2018 in Hawaii. 2019 January HDA convention will be
35 cancelled and a small CE program is being planned for April 2019 (possibly Apr. 11 and
36 12, 2019).

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38 Events that will continue for 2017 include the Women’s Breakfast, Life Member lunch
39 and HDA Young Dentist class on Friday. A new event will be the Ethics class that will
40 be held in place of the pau hana party. With the new licensure legislation of three CE
41 credits per year, the Dental Education Committee decided to provide the ethics lecture
42 during the convention. TDIC has graciously offered to sponsor part of this event since
43 they usually sponsor the pau hana party on Thursday night.
